## CORCORAN WOMEN'S COMMITTEE AWARDS \$15,000 GRANT TO CULTURALDC'S NEW MOBILE ART GALLERY

Washington – The Corcoran Women's Committee (CWC), now an arts study and philanthropy group after the closure of the Corcoran Gallery of Art in 2014, announced Tuesday that CulturalDC and its Mobile Art Gallery was the organization's first grant recipient.

"The grants committee reviewed an impressive group of proposals and we only wish we could have awarded each and every arts group, museum or artist that applied. CulturalDC's Mobile Art Gallery stood out because of it's innovative approach and its impressive reach, having hosted 40,000 visitors in its first 5 months," said Molly Rolandi, CWC grants committee chair and member of the Corcoran Board of Trustees.

"We are honored to be chosen as the CWC's first grant recipient and with these funds we will help CulturalDC engage new communities with innovative creative experiences."

The Women's Committee was founded in 1953 at the request of the Board of Directors of the Corcoran Gallery of Art. Its original mission was to serve as ambassadors for the Gallery and over time it grew into a fundraising committee for both the Gallery and the College. After the museum closed and the college became a part of George Washington University, the group retooled and became an art study and philanthropy group 'dedicated to art and encouraging American genius", as originally etched on the front door of the Flagg Building, home of the Corcoran Gallery of Art.
